

Things You Need To Know – COVID-19 Information

To help stop the spread of COVID-19, Ontario announced that people need to be fully vaccinated in non-essential indoor settings starting Sept 22/21. What this means to us is that everyone in our Centre needs to be fully vaccinated. We are asking our meeting and activity leaders who have not already done so, to ensure that participants are fully vaccinated.

Please have your proof of vaccination available whenever you are at The Centre. If you need your Ontario Vaccine Receipt, visit the Ontario COVID-19 website for details - <https://covid-19.ontario.ca/covid-19-vaccine-booking-support#proof-of-vaccination>.

To show proof of vaccination:

1. show the paper vaccine receipt that you received when you got vaccinated
2. take a photo of your vaccine receipt
3. vaccine Passport (when it becomes available)

Please do not enter the Centre if you are not feeling well or not yet vaccinated.

Wear a mask at all times and keep 2 metres apart.

Sanitize your hands and sign in when entering the Centre or at a Canterbury gathering outdoors. Confirm that you are COVID-19 symptom free by checking the column when signing in. Please sign out when leaving for Contact Tracing.

Everyone cleans what they have touched prior to leaving the Centre. This includes when you are in the washroom, office and library. Disinfectant wipes are available throughout the Centre. Meeting and activity leaders need to complete the new Cleaning Log to confirm that this was done.

There can be up to 25 people in a meeting or activity and no more than 75 people in The Centre. The outdoor capacity is 100 people. Please book every meeting and activity to help us stay within capacity.

If you wish to get vaccinated:

- ✓ Call Durham Region at 1-888-444-5113 or your doctor or your pharmacy. Most Port Perry pharmacies including Shoppers Drug Mart, Walmart, Durham Pharmacy, Pharmacy Associates of Port Perry, Port Perry Remedys RX and Medical Associates of Port Perry offer vaccines.
- ✓ If you need help getting to the vaccination site, Durham Region offers transportation. Please call Community Care Durham at 1-888-255-6680.
- ✓ If you are homebound and meet the eligible criteria, please email RDPSHomeboundCOVIDVaccine@durham.ca to inquire about getting vaccinated at home or inquire at your doctor.

Durham Contact Tracing Required by All Residents In Their Homes

Durham Region announced in Sept 2021 that all hosts of social gatherings are required to maintain a list of full names and contact information for all attendees regardless of age in a private dwelling and/or commercial premises and upon request shall provide the Durham Region Health Department within 24 hours of the request. You need to keep this list for 30 days. A social gathering is 2 or more people not living in the same house. Please see the link from Durham Region for details.
