ROGERS COMMUNICATIONS UPDATE

I am glad to hear that virtually all of the problems we had with Rogers are resolved. There have been a few odd ones come up but the major issue was resolved. Rogers and the CCRA Board had a meeting to discuss next steps.

1. Rogers will be putting Fibre cable directly into Canterbury to allow them to split the subdivision in half. This will double the capacity from what exists today and permanently solve the capacity issues we faced. Expected to finish in September. There may be a small service hit during this work. More to come.

2. Following the Fibre installation Rogers will be issuing a credit to those affected by the outage that is well in excess of their normal credit for outages.

3. Rogers will be supplying our Centre with a year's worth of free service to keep our costs down. The exact services included are under discussion.

4. Rogers will supply training to those who feel they would benefit from in-person training. If you are interested, please email the following details to me at John@Nesbitts.ca by Sept 20th.

- a brief description of any specific questions you have

Depending on the need, we can do smaller sessions or Rogers has agreed to send a technician to each house to help. Covid still prevents large training sessions.

5. There are also some other things under discussion that might help with our costs. More to come.

6. Utility locates on the road are for Bell to install Fibre Optics in our community. They expect to complete the work this fall. Their Fibre service works in a manner similar to Rogers. Then we can probably expect sign up information to those who feel compelled to switch providers.

As always please call Rogers tech support with problems first and if you're not happy let me know by email with your name, Tel Number, Address and a brief description of the problem, so I can assist.
