NEW COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT (AVENU PROJECT)

On March 13 three representatives from AVENU met with the Board of Directors to review the feedback from the March 7 presentation at the Coffee Hour attended by Mayor Wooten, Councillor Coyne and CAO Nix. The Board has requested a second presentation to all of the residents of Canterbury Common. AVENU will provide two full-size updated drawings that residents can view at The Centre.

Lou Rocha and Phil Egginton attended a stakeholder meeting on March 19th. A dozen people were invited along with Mayor Wooten, Terry Coyne, Ken Nix and other councillors. The AVENU team described the scope and process for their project and announced the official name of the new community, which will be called EQUUS. We presented several questions that were raised at our Coffee Hour on March 7th and will share the responses when we receive them in writing.

50 MILLION TREES PROGRAM

The Kawartha Conservation Authority has approved a grant to plant 500 seedlings on the west side of the former 4th fairway and the north side of the former 3rd fairway. The 50 Million Trees Program is an environmental initiative supported by the federal and provincial governments that is intended to restore and preserve forested areas in communities like Canterbury.

PROPOSED SENIORS RESIDENCE

LEV Living is expected to provide its feasibility report by the end of March. In the OMB Minutes of Settlement, CCRA, the Region of Durham, the Township of Scugog, the Puckrin Family and the Canterbury Land Development Corporation (Geranium) signed an agreement for a 4-storey building. LEV Living has proposed a larger building to hold 215 units. The Board will share new information as it is received.
