### NEW COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT (AVENU PROJECT)

Representatives from the AVENU project met with Board members via ZOOM on March 27th and April 11th. AVENU will give a presentation to the Canterbury residents on May 6<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 p.m. in The Centre. Registration will be open next week.

### PROPOSED SENIORS RESIDENCE

The Board met with the CEO of LEV Living via ZOOM on April 15<sup>th</sup>. LEV Living has received its phase one Market Feasibility Report and has proceeded to phase two of their analysis. LEV will complete a financial analysis and will determine its plans by late May. The next step would be to engage an architectural firm to design a basic concept for presentation to the township and community. The presentation of the plan would occur in late summer contingent on a favourable market report and financial analysis.

### ANNUAL MEETING

The Annual Meeting is scheduled for June 19<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. in The Centre. The information package will be delivered by hand to each home starting on June 1<sup>st</sup> The package will contain an Information Circular, a proxy form and annual reports. #### SAFETY RELATED ITEMS FOR OUR HOMEOWNERS

It's a good time to check your smoke detectors and co2 detectors for being in compliance (still working and not expired) Typically smoke detectors will go 10 years before the sensors are end of life. Many insurance companies home owner coverage for hot water tank rupture causing basement flooding. Damage coverage is only valid if the hot water tank is under 10 years old. If your tank is older than 10 years, it's best to contact your home insurance company to ensure you have adequate coverage.

Now that the better weather is upon us, walking in the parklands and meadows (the former golf course holes CCRA now owns) is more frequent. Always use care and caution when walking across the meadow lands as over winter buckling, erosion and wildlife burrows can have occurred in areas that were previously flat and stable. Extra caution should be exercised at night.

There have been reports of random callers telephoning our homeowners. The caller has been reported to ask the resident to come to the front door. Upon opening the front door, there is no one to be seen except a car parked near the curb in front of the resident's house. What may seem like an innocent prank, could be a means of identity theft. We always need to be vigilant. Answering a telephone call from an unknown source would provide a bad actor with information on your voice tone, possible age and of course with your home address and telephone number, which is available from the phone provider via a reverse look up. Coming to the front door would also provide an individual the ability to take a photograph of your face. Always be vigilant as identity theft fraudsters are out there and getting more creative all the time.
